




What is EduTrace?



ADVOCACY

Working with our members we look to respond to and highlight issues as well as develop positions that ensure Nuclear Medicine professionals are represented.

Our advocacy and research aims to inform and influence government and allied professions - making sure that nuclear medicine professionals are involved in decisions that affect our profession and the outcomes of patients.

Scientific Advisory Panel (SAP)

Each year the Society responds to state and federal requests for information and submissions. In the last few years we have been involved with ANSTO, the Federal Departments of Health as well as Industry and Immigration. In addition, we liaise with state and federal regulatory bodies.

We also share close relations with international peer societies and associations including the SNMMI and EANM and in the last few years we have co-authored position papers as

well as contributed to the The Lancet Oncology Commission on medical imaging and nuclear medicine a ground breaking report. More recently, we have been involved with the EANM. In addition, through the work of our committees we create positions and papers. Some of our specialist groups and committees are :

ADVOCACY

Special Focus: Technologist Workforce Advocacy Working Group (WFA)

The purpose of the working group is to understand and interpret issues relevant for ANZSNM technologist members from the Medical Radiation Practitioners Board of Australia (MRPBA), the New Zealand Medical Radiation Technologists Board (NZMRTB) and other health authorities.

We also focus on workforce issues related to nuclear medicine technologists through interactions with the appropriate authorities as requested by the Federal Council.

Recent projects we have been involved with have included:

- Provided feedback on behalf of the ANZSNM on the MRPBA Public consultation on National exam guidelines and the APRHA/MRPBA Public consultation on the review of the Shared Code of Conduct

- Finalising documentation relating to changes to the Overseas Qualification Assessment process
- The resurrection of the mentorship program
- Review of Scope of Practice information on the ANZSNM website
- Constantly scanning the NMT workforce environment and offering support and advice where needed.
