



The Elizabeth Bailey Lecture Award Rules

Overview

The Australia and New Zealand Society of Nuclear Medicine (ANZSNM) Technologist Special Interest Group (TSIG) awarded the inaugural 'Dr Elizabeth Bailey Lecture' as part of the 2021 TSIG Annual Technologist Day Symposium. Created to celebrate the impact that Dr Elizabeth Bailey has had on the Nuclear Medicine industry through her leadership, advocacy, and passion, this lecture aims to commend the work of someone who is making a significant impact within the Nuclear Medicine Technologist industry in much the same way as she has.

Dr Elizabeth 'Liz' Bailey has been a Nuclear Medicine Technologist for nearly three decades. Currently serving as the Chief Nuclear Medicine Technologist at Royal North Shore Hospital (RNSH) in Sydney, she has completed both a MBA and a PhD. She has been a member of the ANZSNM her entire career, where she has served more than 20 years in various positions, most notably as the ANZSNM President from 2012-2014 and as Chair of the TSIG from 2007-2012, 2014-2016 and again from 2017-2019. She was instrumental in creating the TSIG Annual Technologists Day Symposium, an event to provide Nuclear Medicine Technologists their own platform for education and collaboration within the ANZSNM. Liz has always had an ability to connect with the many passionate and driven people within the Nuclear Medicine industry, and many will attest to her role in mentoring them in their own professional careers.

Rules

The 'Dr Elizabeth Bailey Lecture' is presented as a keynote speaker at the TSIG Annual Technologist Day Symposium. The Award is for a Technologist member who has made an outstanding and highly valued contribution to the field of Clinical Nuclear Medicine, Nuclear Medicine Research or service to the profession, in Australia or New Zealand. Significant contributions to the Nuclear Medicine industry include areas of advocacy, leadership, innovation, or furthering the capabilities of Nuclear Medicine Technologists.

The recipient of the 'Dr Elizabeth Bailey Lecture' must be a financial ANZSNM member and a member of the Society for at least 12 months at the time of nomination. The recipient will be required to deliver the Dr Elizabeth Bailey Lecture at the TSIG Annual Technologist Day Symposium held via Zoom or in person.

The TSIG Symposium Organising Committee will call for nominations from Technologist members of the ANZSNM at the ANZSNM Annual Scientific Meeting. Nominations will be open for one (1) month



and submitted to the ANZSNM Secretariat email (secretariat@anzsnm.org.au). Nominations should include a statement of no more than 250 words clearly stating the basis of the nomination and a brief (no more than five (5) pages) curriculum vitae of the nominee. All nominations will be retained and considered for future years.

Nominations will be shortlisted by the TSIG Symposium Organising Committee in consultation with the TSIG Oversight Committee. The final selection will be dependent on acceptance and availability of the nominee, although a virtual or pre-recorded talk may be considered. The lecture will consist of, but is not limited to, the work that the recipient is being commended for.

Award

The awardee will be provided with a return economy class airfare, accommodation and registration to attend the TSIG Annual Technologist Day Symposium. Dr Elizabeth Bailey will be notified of the appointed lecturer and will be invited to the lecture as a matter of courtesy by the TSIG Oversight Committee and the TSIG Symposium Committee. On completion of the lecture, the awardee will be presented with a commemorative plaque in honour of their contribution to nuclear medicine by the ANZSNM. This will be organised by the TSIG Symposium Organising Committee and the ANZSNM Secretariat
